- Go to http://deanofstudents.utexas.edu/sald/studentorgs/vieworgs.php to look up a type of activism to which you wouldn't normally gravitate. It's about seeing new things and hearing new ideas, not visiting a meeting you were going to anyway. You can type things like "feminism," "AIDS," or "support troops," all of which lead you to interesting groups that will be happy to have you at a meeting. You could also just make somebody's day and actually take a flyer. Your choice.
- Attend a meeting and get some information about the group. Engage, ask questions, share your ideas and make your presence known. Remember that stepping out of your comfort zone a little is part of the exercise.
- Write a short (1-2 pages double-spaced) account of your experience. What happened at the meeting? Did you agree with the ideas shared? Will you be going back? Make it interesting. I'll be reading a lot of these.
